Canada's 2011 U19 Women's Lacrosse Team Head Coach Announced

December 10, 2009 – Ottawa, Ontario - The Canadian Lacrosse Association's Women's Sector is pleased to announce the appointment of Scott Teeter as Head Coach for the 2011 Canadian U19 Women's National Team. The team will compete at the Federation of International Lacrosse (FIL) World U19 Championship in Hannover, Germany in August of 2011.



The 2005 MAAC Coach of the Year, Scott is in his eighth season leading Buffalo's Canisius College women's lacrosse team. He has won 44 games since taking the reins of the Golden Griffin program, the second-most wins by a MAAC coach during that period. The Griffs have reached the MAAC Tournament in 3 of the last four years with a trip to the championship in 2006.

Individual achievements have been a common theme under Teeter's leadership. He has mentored 20 players to earn All-MAAC accolades, while three players were honored with offensive or defensive player of the year honours.

Teeter was a four-year letter winner for the Canisius ice hockey team, graduating from the school in 2002 with a degree in physical education and later earned his masters degree in physical education with a concentration in sport psychology and coaching from Canisius in 2004. He grew up in Shelburne, Ontario playing field lacrosse for his high school, and box lacrosse for the Orangeville Northmen.

Scott has a good familiarity with players in the Canadian system, having spent many hours watching local games during the summer months in communities around Ontario. Among the qualities he brings to the program are an expertise in the strategic and tactical aspects of the game, a philosophy of building all facets of the team through a systematic approach, and a sense that success is built on hard work. With players who share that conviction and a staff to support them in every way, he believes Team Canada can rise to a new level of achievement.

"I'd like to thank the search committee for this great honour," said Teeter. "I am truly blessed to be representing my country at an international tournament. I have high expectations for Team Canada and look forward to the challenges that await."
